**NOT ACCEPTABLE:** Documents submitted in image file format (e.g. jpeg) instead of PDF format  
Government aid documents that do not display your first and last name

## **[D] SUBMISSION DEADLINE & INSTRUCTIONS**

The completed bursary application form and supporting documents in the proper format are due by the end of day **FEBRUARY 15<sup>th</sup> 2021**.

1. The application form a fillable PDF document
